PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

It's October! I hope you have had a good start to the school year. I know I've been staying busy!

Some of you may have been contacted by the OSEA state office in Salem, thanking you for your continued support and ensuring that you know who your president is and who to get in touch with if you have any issues, questions, or concerns. Please know that I am ready and willing to assist you!

I have been thinking about why I continue to participate in OSEA membership and activities. My answer isn't straight-forward, but rather more of a journey. In the 15 years that I have been in the workforce, I would say that at least 75% of my jobs have had union affiliation. I'll admit, in many of those I was that person in the back of the room that tuned out any time the union was brought up. I just didn't see why it mattered.

My views on unions began to change as I was injured on the job, in multiple jobs. I had to wonder if employers would provide worker's comp if they weren't required to do so by law. And then, I was working in all grades across the Beaverton School District and saw first-hand the struggles classified employees face every day. A friend suggested I consider representing instructional support staff on the OSEA Beaverton Chapter Executive Board. I had no idea what that meant, so naturally I said "yes!" Since that time I have served on our executive board 3 different times, and now as president.

What I have learned from all of this is that having a voice makes a difference. Unity makes a difference. Knowing my rights makes a difference. Fair wages, health insurance, paid sick leave...or any sick leave, rest periods, working conditions, and a defined work week did not all come about because employers felt like they should provide those things. These things exist because of the work that our union brothers and sisters across the country began in the 19th century, in response to being over-worked, underpaid, and being forced to work in hazardous conditions. I don't want to be in history books as a number who let that work be erased.

FLU SHOT CLINICS

BSD Regence medical members may receive free flu shots at the BSD flu shot clinics listed below.

They (and their eligible dependents) may also receive free flu shots at a Regence participating pharmacy if the pharmacy electronically bills Regence for the flu shot (e.g. getaflushot.com and Walgreens).

BSD Kaiser members may receive their free flu shot at their Kaiser medical clinic beginning in early October; Kaiser has posted their flu shot clinics on their website: www.kp.org/flu.

BSD Flu Shot Clinics: no pre-registration required, family members welcome, ages 11 to adult - cost: free (Regence Blue Cross members must bring their medical card for the free shot.)

To apply, **print the form**, fill it out, have it signed by a chapter officer and scanned by them to the OSEA State Office.


GET DISCOUNT TICKETS TO BLAZERS GAMES

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

Do you take your break(s) every day that you work? Are you aware of the number and length of breaks you are entitled to, based on the number of hours you work each day? Do you skip your

break(s) because you just have too much work to do or combine them with your lunch or departure time? Your answers to these questions should be yes, yes and no. If they are not, then please read on.

I cannot count the number of members that have told me that they just don't have time to take breaks because they are too busy or that they don't want to leave students unattended. While both of these reasons are noble and speak to the deep ethics of classified employees, they don't justify not receiving your contractual and legal, breaks.

First thing I encourage you to do is talk with your supervisor immediately if you are not scheduled for or are not taking your break(s) and meal period at the scheduled times. If you have any issues or concerns regarding that advice, please contact me at kim@osea.org. You have language in your contract that spells out the break(s) and meal period that you should receive; based on the number of hours you work each day. I am including it here for your reference and hope that you will continue to become familiar with your rights.

ARTICLE 19 REST AND MEAL PERIODS

A. Under normal circumstances, each hourly employee who works six (6) or more consecutive hours per day shall be entitled to an uninterrupted meal period of at least thirty (30) minutes and not more than one (1) hour.

- 1. Such meal period shall be as scheduled by the employee's supervisor and be as close to mid-shift as practical.
- 2. Such meal period shall be without pay and shall not be credited as time worked for any purpose.
- B. Hourly Employees are entitled to a paid fifteen (15) minute rest period for every four (4) hour segment or major portion thereof of the employee's paid work period.
- 1. A "major portion" of four hours means any segment great than two (2) hours.
- 2. For work periods less than two (2) hours, no rest or meal period will be given.
- 3. For work periods over two (2) hours but less than six (6) hours, one fifteen (15) minute rest period will be given.
- 4. For work periods of six (6) hours, one (1) break and one (1) meal period will be given.
- 5. For work periods over six (6) hours, two fifteen (15) minute rest periods and one (1) meal period will be given.
- 6. Employees scheduled for split shifts will receive rest and meal periods based on the total amount of hours scheduled for an eight (8) hour work day.
- C. Exempt employees are exempt from rest and meal periods as provided for hourly employees.

Number of Rest and Meal Periods required based on length of work period

Length of <u>Paid</u> Work Period	Number of rest periods	Number of Meal Periods
2 hrs or less	0	0
2 hrs, 1 min – 5 hrs, 59 mins	1	0
6 hrs	1	1
6 hrs, 1 min – 10 hrs	2	1
